<u>Requirements to Apply-</u> Families whose children will thrive in a project-based learning environment with 21<sup>st</sup> Century skills and technology (character, collaboration, communication, creativity, critical thinking) are encouraged to apply. Any Hall County School District student in grades kindergarten-fifth grade may apply.

- 1) Parents must provide transportation if they live outside the MVES attendance zone.
- 2) Families must be committed to active involvement in our magnet school.
- 3) Required records must accompany the application to be considered for enrollment. After enrolling at MVES, the expectations are: If a magnet school student has persistent problems with attendance (including unexcused absences, tardies, or check-outs), behavior, and/or academic performance, then he/she may have to return to his/her home school.
- 4) If a student is applying for kindergarten magnet status, please note that kindergarten acceptances will be announced following HCSD kindergarten registration dates in late April.

## **MVES Magnet School Continuation Policy**

Hall County students are assigned to schools based on their residential addresses, and all schools have a variety of excellent programming options to meet students' needs. However, it is our belief that students are most successful when they are involved in programs that engage and motivate them, that capitalize on their unique talents and interests. Consequently, Hall County Schools offers a school choice program that makes a highly personalized education available to all students. Students may apply to a school with a certain focus or a school with a unique program that matches their individual interests, aptitudes and goals.

A student who has been accepted into Mt. Vernon Exploratory School may continue in the school provided that he/she demonstrates satisfactory attendance, achievement and behavior. Satisfactory performance is indicated by the student showing progress in each class. The student is expected to complete all required assignments; to actively participate in class activities; and to show exemplary work habits, process skills, academic growth and progress towards mastery of the standards in the class(es). Students must demonstrate satisfactory behavior and attendance.

- \*In the event that the student does not meet the continuation criteria, he/she will be placed on probation. In addition, the following steps will be taken:
- 1. An MVES administrator, classroom teacher(s), parent(s)/guardian(s) and the student will develop an attendance, academic, and/or behavioral plan for improvement. The improvement plan will state conditions that must be met in order for the student to continue to be enrolled at MVES. A copy of the improvement plan will be shared with parent(s)/guardian(s).
- 2. At the end of the probationary period, the MVES administrator and teachers will review the student's progress and determine whether the conditions of the improvement plan have been met. If the conditions of the plan have been met, the student may continue enrollment. If the conditions of the plan have not been met, the student will be withdrawn from MVES and may return to his/her zoned elementary school.
- 3. If the student has not met all the requirements of his/her contract, but is showing progress and all agree that it is in the child's best interest to continue to try to succeed at MVES, the child may be granted an extended probationary period. If the end of the probationary period comes towards the end of the year, it is possible that all may agree the child will continue to finish out the year with the understanding that he/she will not return to the program in the fall.
- \*With approval of the Superintendent or his/her designee, the principal may request that out-of-zone attendance be terminated at any time for non-compliance of rules/regulations. (from Hall County School System Transfer Form)
